#### **EXPANDING THREE PILLARS**

2021 was an exciting time for Three Pillars. We started two major projects, which we will complete in 2022. The modernizing of our Health Care Center (HCC), and the expansion of Riverside Lodge (RSL).

When complete, current and future residents at the HCC will have private rooms and baths, and more intimate dining spaces.

When RSL is complete we will have 52 new higher-level assisted living units, for a total of 69 including our current memory care.

The completion of both of these projects in 2022 is just the beginning for our growth over the next few years as we begin work on Independent Living, Memory Care, and our future campus expansion on our newly acquired 190 acres just north of our campus.

I am proud of how we continued to navigate the pandemic, while keeping our residents safe and engaged, while looking out for each other.

Finally, we remain grateful to our generous residents and families who donated and supported us throughout the year.
